Safety in Our School

We work hard to keep our students safe at school, and we do our best to make sure that they get home safely every day. Several recent incidents have led to this reminder: -

• Traffic awareness – installation of the flashing School Zone signs around our school is expected to take place this week. In many cases installation is closely followed by a police campaign of enforcement, to make sure that the community is well aware of the speed restrictions and the timing of the School Zone.



- Playground safety supervisory care is provided for children by the school staff
 whenever a teacher is on playground duty. A teacher is scheduled for the playground
 from 8.20 am, until bell time at 2.45, each day. Outside these hours, children using
 the grounds are the responsibility of their parents or carers.
- Safe entry and exit from the Brown Street side is only by the pathway behind the hedge, keeping children away from the staff car park, or by the Main Office entrance.
- Skateboards and scooters are ridden to school entirely at the discretion of parents.
