## Change

Change is something that I embrace and feel comfortable with. As a youngest, I moved around

## **Equity**

The longer you spend in your own place, the less you notice and the more you habituate. A perspective change disturbs us, but is actually good for us. The symbolism of changing perspective is one that we will return to in education.

## Experience

The third reason for the change is the reality of change. Paradoxically, change is a constant in life. It will not always be something that we look for, or want, or welcome. It will not always be something that we agree with, or support. It will, however, keep on happening. It is a good thing to

experience change, and to learn how to get through it.

The change within our school, is not an overthrowing of tradition for its own sake, nor is it one of great moment in the life of the school. The reality is that the new systems and ways of doing things will become the new normal. 'Normal', in this context, is simply another way of saying 'what I am used to'.

"Thanks to all of the parents who contributed this year to the School Council, both representatives on the Council in particular, Jaimie Navalli for undertaking the role of Secretary and those who weren't officially representatives but still came to the meetings to participate in the discussions of the Council. Without those volunteers the Council would not have been able to achieve what it has this year.

We would also like to extend our gratitude to the Community Representatives, Kevin Fell and Christine Sheppard and staff members, Todd Daniels and Sarah Kerr who gave up their evenings to provide essential community and staff perspectives to the discussions had at the council.

The Council achieved some fairly substantial outcomes this year. We petitioned the state government and succeeded in ensuring the new build included air conditioning, which was not in the original brief. There was a significant review of the council's constitution which is currently at the Department of Education for ratification. The new constitution will be introduced at the AGM early next year and elections will be held under the new constitution for representatives, so we look forward to seeing parents being more involved.

Without them we would not have been able to get through the review to ensure that the document was a true reflection of our role as a Council and the aims and responsibilities we felt truly reflected the school.

## **OOSH Update**



## Works notification

#### December 2018

Site establishment and construction works have commenced and between December 2018 and the end of February 2019, Artel Constructions will:

- install fencing and hoardings to separate the site from the school grounds
- remove trees within the site to facilitate construction. New trees will be planted as part of finishing landscaping works at the end of the project
- remediate known asbestos within the site in strict accordance with all applicable legislation, regulations, policies and guidelines
- begin bulk excavation, removal of the existing COLA, relocation of existing services.

#### Temporary Closure of Brown Street between Kitchener Parade and Tyrell Street

The removal and relocation of the existing COLA away from the school site will require oversized vehicle movements.

To facilitate these movements, a short section of Brown Street between Kitchener Parade and Tyrell Street will be closed on 10th December 2018 between 9.00am and 2.30pm.

Traffic control will be in place for the safety of students, the local community and workers. Road users are advised to obey the directions of traffic controllers at all times.

#### Remediation work - 7 to 24 January 2019

There is known asbestos within the site that will potentially need to be remediated as part of the site establishment and early works.

The health, safety and well-being of students, staff and our neighbours is our highest priority, and all necessary measures will be implemented to ensure that the material is remediated safely.

Any material found on site will be removed during the school holidays between 7 and 24 January 2019, weather and site conditions permitting.

This work will be carried out by a licensed asbestos removal contractor and will be conducted in accordance with the Department of Education's Asbestos Management Plan and Safe Work NSW requirements. A hygienist will conduct air monitoring during the remdiation works to ensure there is no exposure to workers or the general public.

Please be aware that removal of asbestos will pose no risk to staff, students or the local community.


#### Working hours

Over the Christmas and New Year period, there will be a site shut down from 5pm, Saturday 22 December 2018 to 7am, Monday 7 January 2019.




