Learning Support Team (LST)

Our LST meets regularly. Members of our LST include executive staff, learning and support staff, as well as the School Counsellor.

The prime function of our LST is to ensure that the needs of all students in our school are being met. Our team employs a strong focus on systems (what we can do to support our teachers) and practices (what we can do to support our students).

At any point in time, a student may experience difficulties with learning or face challenges with their emotional or social wellbeing. These difficulties may vary in cause, nature, intensity and duration.

In their daily contact with students, classroom teachers are usually the first to identify students who require additional support and will often engage the services of the LST. When this occurs, the classroom teacher would also consult with you about their observations or concerns.

Similarly, should you ever have concerns about your child's learning or wellbeing needs, it is important that you make a time to discuss these with your child's teacher. In following up, the teacher may refer on to the LST for advice or request provision for additional support.

An LST meeting is routinely held with parents when significant intervention from the LST occurs. For example, when School Counsellor assessment occurs after parent permission is given. Such meetings can occur at any time throughout the year.

Home School Liaison Officers

Home School Liaison Officers (HSLO) are employed by the Department of Education (DoE) to monitor school attendance and to provide a supportive resource for students, parents and schools.

Their role is to encourage regular school attendance of all students at school. When there is attendance difficulties, they work with the school in an attempt to resolve them.

Our HSLO meets with an executive member up to three times per term, to discuss students who are falling below the DoE 90% attendance benchmark.

They generally monitor poor or unexplained attendance patterns.

A reminder that it is a legal requirement to explain all student absences promptly. Partial absences (arriving late or leaving early) also require an explanation. An explanation is easiest given by replying to the SMS message sent out on the morning of absence, or in writing upon your child's return to school.

The school is legally required to follow up on any unexplained full or part days leave after 2 days of continuous absence. In this instance, your child's teacher will often phone to make sure that all is well and offer assistance, if required.

If you have concerns about your child's attendance at school, please do not hesitate to contact the school.

Building Update


Work continues on our new build. At this stage, we are hoping to get the keys towards the end of this term and we are planning on moving all classes during week 10 ready for the 2020 school year.

Newcastle East Public SchoolProject update

September 2019

A project is underway to upgrade Newcastle East Public School. Works include the construction of four new flexible learning spaces, a new covered outdoor learning area, refurbishment of the staff administration area, and replacing the roof of the existing heritage building.

Temporary relocation of administration area

During the October school holidays, the existing administration area will be temporarily relocated to the north-west corner of the school near the OOSH, to allow for the refurbishment of the existing administration area to commence (please refer to site map overleaf).

The temporary admin location can be easily accessed via the existing entry to the school off Tyrell Street and will be operational from day 1, Term 4 2019 until the refurbishment works are completed in 2020.

Replacing the roof of the existing heritage building

Newcastle East Public School is a site of historical significance in Australian education and with the age of the site and the buildings come some unique challenges. The roof of the main building (Block A) needs to be replaced and bonded (non-friable) asbestos has been identified in the existing roof tiles. This is not unusual for a building of this age as asbestos containing material was a commonly used building material between the 1940s and the 1980s.

The existing roof tiles will be removed by a licensed asbestos removal contractor during the Christmas school holidays. The works will be conducted in accordance with the Department of Education's Asbestos Management Plan, Asbestos Removal Code of Practice and Safe Work NSW requirements.

The health, safety and well-being of students, staff and our neighbours is of highest priority, and all necessary measures have been and will continue to be carried out to ensure that the material is removed safely.

Upcoming community meetings

Two community meetings will be held at the school in Term 4 to further inform the community on the scope of these works and timing. A specialist hygienist will also be available to respond to any questions from the school community.

The meetings will be held at Newcastle East Public School Library on:

- Tuesday 15 October 6.00-7.00pm
- Monday 28 October 5.00-6.00pm

Why not try these ideas?

There are many ways for children to be physically active and to limit sedentary behaviour every day.





ACTIVE AND FUN

- Encourage children to play active games like obstacle courses, tag, skipping or throwing a ball or frisbee.
- · Visit playgrounds, parks, nature reserves, ovals or beaches.
- Get children involved in a variety of different sports and activities.



ACTIVE TRAVEL

- · For short trips, walk or ride safely.
- For longer trips, park the car some distance away and walk with children for the rest of the trip.



ACTIVE AT HOME

- Limit time for watching TV and using electronic games.
- Store portable electronic devices out of sight.
- Enjoy a walk with children around your local area.
- Children can help with gardening activities like digging, sweeping or raking.



ACTIVE AND SAFE

- Start slowly and build up the amount and intensity of physical activity.
- Protect children from the sun ensure children wear sun-protective clothing, including a hat, and apply sunscreen regularly.
- Always supervise children appropriately when in and around water.
- Speak with your doctor or other health professional if your child has a medical condition.
