Organising Classes for 2021

Term 4 is slipping by and next month the process of organising students into classes for next year will begin. If there are significant issues we need to be aware of when allocating your child to a class, please make sure they have been made known to your classroom teacher, Assistant Principals or myself. Teachers are meeting soon to begin sorting children into classes. It is not our intention to provide parents with the opportunity to select a teacher of choice. We have developed a very strong teaching team and parents can be confident the needs of their child will be met by any member of our team.

Developing well-balanced classes is best for everyone and that can be made difficult if there are large numbers of requests – as such, it is important that placement requests be founded on significant reasons and not related to specific teachers.

We try to accommodate parent requests with regard to student placements, but as you will understand, this is not always possible. It is also important when we come to organise classes that we know of students who will not be at our school next year.

If your family is moving on, please let us know as soon as possible on the "Intention to Enrol 2021" sheet.

2021 Kinder Parent Information

The 'Helping your child with literacy and numeracy at home' booklet has been created for parents, carers and families of children in the early years of school. The activities in the booklet are designed for parents to support their child's first year of learning at school. They are fun and engaging and are linked to key foundational early learning skills. The activities cover the areas that are assessed in the Best Start Kindergarten Assessment. When conducting feedback sessions with parents after the assessment, specific activities can be suggested to engage and support students at home.

Practical games are included in the following areas:

- Speaking and listening
- Reading
- Drawing and writing
- Numbers and counting
- Adding and subtracting
- Identifying and creating patterns.

Debating

Assessment and Reporting

This term teachers will be conducting final assessments in preparation for the end of year student reports. Students will be assessed against state-wide syllabus outcomes and standards using a five point achievement scale. Students will be assessed as to where they are achieving in relation to grade levels.

A common misconception made by parents is that students are assessed against the other students in their grade at this school and if they are at the top of their grade, they should be assessed as 'Well Above Target Level'. This is not the case. Students are assessed against statewide syllabus standards, not school standards. Student reports will be sent home on Thursday 10 December.

Interrelate

Interrelate will be taking place on Wednesday 2 and Thursday 3 December this term. The program 'Amazing Me' will be facilitated by Interrelate staff and will involve all Year 5 and Year 6 students. Further information, cost and notes will be sent out via Skoolbag and Sentral in the coming weeks

Building Work - Playground Upgrade

Between Monday 26 October 2020 and Sunday 8 November 2020 work will include:

- Finishing the stormwater improvement works and some drainage works
- Preparing and installing new play areas and equipment, including the new cricket pitch

- Installing new boundary fencing.

Illustrator visit with Sami Bayly


Last week we had our illustrator visit from local illustrator Sami Bayly. The children and teachers really enjoyed meeting
