

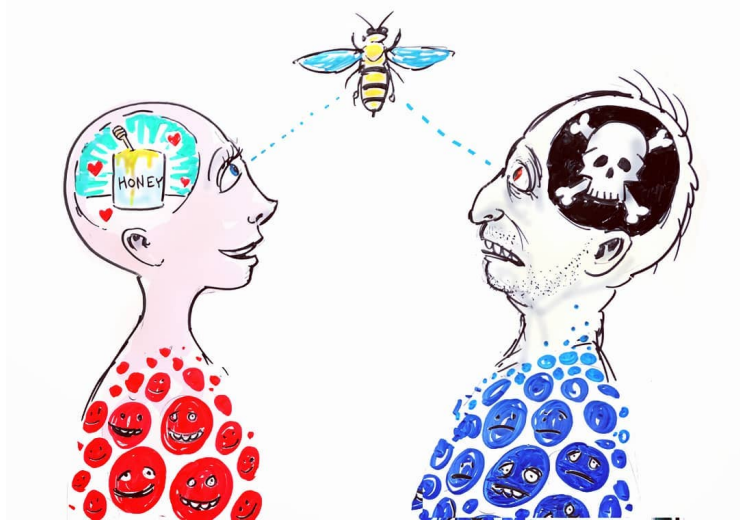

Assessment and Reporting

As the year is beginning to wind down, teachers are undertaking assessment tasks in preparation for the end of year reports. Classrooms have been busy places with all students currently being assessed on the outcomes that they have been expected to achieve throughout the year.

Assessments will take the form of class tests, standardised tests, ongoing work samples and informal and formal observations. Reports are due to go home to parents on Thursday 10th December.

Information for Parents

Don't forget to keep up with the latest advice from the Department of Education about COVID-19 and schools. Here is a summary of the key points.

What has Changed

- Presentation Day can proceed with a limited parent audience providing COVID Guidelines are followed.
- Year 6 students can have their graduation bear or ball signed but must provide their own pen.
- Year 6 Farewell can proceed with dancing but COVID Guidelines must be followed.
- P&C Meetings will be able to be held on site, after school hours but is to be capped at 20 attendees. COVID Guidelines must be in place.

What remains the same

- Non-essential adults are not to come onto school grounds, with the exception of late arrival and early pick up and may only enter as outlined in a point below.
- All contact with the school should be done via email or phone. Where face to face contact is necessary you must go via the office.
- No student, staff member or parent is to come onto school grounds if they are feeling unwell.
- Physical distancing of 1.5 metres must be practiced by all adults at all times.

Change to Staff Development Days 2021

Recently we were informed of a change to the 2021 school calendar. Staff Development Days are pupil free days at school for staff to plan and undertake professional learning. The number of allocated days will remain the same but it has been decided to move one of them from the end to the beginning of the year.

Commencing at the start of 2021, the changes include an increase from one to two Staff Development Days at the commencement of Term 1 with only one Staff Development Day at the end of 2021. Therefore, the School Development Days are scheduled for 27 and 28 January next year, with students in Years 1-6 returning on Friday, 29

January, 2021. Kindergarten students will begin the following week on Wednesday, 3rd February. We hope this information helps with your planning for next year.

There are no changes to school term dates this year with students finishing on Wednesday, 16 December.

Playground Upgrade
